Defining the Humanitarian Setting


What is a complex crisis?

"A situation with complex social, political and economic origins which involves the breakdown of state structures, the disputed legitimacy of host authorities, the abuse of human rights and possibly armed conflict, that creates humanitarian needs. The term is generally used to differentiate humanitarian needs arising from conflict and instability from those that arise from natural disasters." (ALNAP)

- Conflict and Instability
- Complex/Protracted Crisis
- Climate variability
